FOSSIL FROM HELL

Being a nature enthusiast, I have always wanted to incorporate nature in my designing process. A lot of factors are involved in the endangerment of nature and species around us. Through my collection, I want to portray how pollution is vandalising nature.

The Vampire Squid caught my eye because of its uniqueness. Found throughout temperate and tropical oceans in extreme deep-sea conditions, they are not considered to be threatening to humans. They dwell in the oxygen minimum belts of the ocean, where virtually no light penetrates. They are also one of the marine species ageing back to the dinosaur era and now are endangered due to marine pollution. These living fossils are the inspiration for my collection. The fabrics used are treated with chemicals, which take years to dissolve in water and soil. My garments also portray the anatomy of these beautiful squids along the way.





I am a person who loves colours because of how distinct and unique it makes each and everything. I have always been drawn towards nature. I remember once getting dressed as a candle because my mother love candles. She feels that light is the source of happiness and good energies. This inspired me to experiment more with clothes. This memory of me dressing like a candle has always inspired me to create clothes that are different. I used to watch a lot of fashion shows and am inclined towards the most unique and extravagant fashion. Fashion, to me, is unique and never-seen-before silhouettes, new and innovative technologies, and my love for unconventional material and experimental fabrics.

















Pakarnnattam in Kathakali is a form of acting where one actor adorns characteristics of two characters as a mono act with the essence and emotional attributes of both. The theme for my graduation show is Kathakali with a touch of Expressionism.

Kathakali is something that is spiritual and has acquired the epitome of power and confidence in my mind since childhood. In today's anxiety and depression engulfed world, my collection aims to provide self-confidence and a powerful image to people through clothing. Expressionism is something that conveys the message of looking at the emotional and expressive side of the matter rather than its materialistic existence. Through my garments, I want to fuse the aura and power of being in a Kathakali costume and the message derived through the Expressionism movement. Inspirations for silhouettes and fabrics are taken from 80's power clothing, as well as from the Aharya Abhinaya (decorative elements like a costume, makeup, accessories etc.) of Kathakali. The bold strokes of Ernst Ludwig Kirchner, the early cubism paintings of Franz Marc, and the brush strokes of Eric Heckel are taken as inspiration for many of the elements.


MOSANTINE

The flattened surface of the flower is outlined by machine embroidery with floral motifs and I have used pastel colours for the garments to enhance the look of the embroidery. The garments are made of pure fabrics namely satin, silk, and chiffon. The overall vibe is very comfortable with a hint of playfulness.

Flowers represent the decorative and emotional liveliness in their bloom. They lure with beauty and fascinate with their form. My idea of loving flowers is different than others. The inspiration for my collection is pressed flowers. The pressed flower effect is drying out flower petals and leaves in a flower press to flatten and exclude light and moisture. Pressing flowers makes them appear flat and there is often a change in colour, ranging from faded colours to a greater intensity of vibrant colours. I can personally connect to the theme, since I always believed in keeping flowers between book pages as a sign of perseverance and nostalgia.
